

Residence Permit (B)

Legal basis:	Art. 20, Art. 22 and Art. 34 of the Act on the Free Movement of Person (PFZG, LGBI. 2009 No. 348) apply to EEA and Swiss nationals and their family members Art. 23 and Art. 26 of the Act on Foreign Nationals (AuG, LGBI. 2008 No. 311) apply to non-EEA and non-Swiss nationals and their family members
Scope of application:	All nationals whose residence permit B expires and whose further stay must be extended.
Deadlines:	The application must be submitted in full and correctly to the Migration and Passport Office no later than 14 days before the residence permit expires.
Integration agreement:	Persons whose residence permits were issued in accordance with the provisions of the Foreign Nationals Act (AuG, LGBI. 2008 No. 311) are generally obliged to conclude an integration agreement. If you have any questions, please contact the Integration Officer at the Migration and Passport Office (APA).
General information:	Individuals who spend the majority of their time abroad for the purpose of studying/training should use the form Retention of permit (ger. „Beibehalt der Bewilligung“). Persons who return to Liechtenstein every day despite studying/training do not need to retain their permit. However, the daily return to Liechtenstein must be confirmed in writing (informally).

Establishment (C)

Legal basis:	Articles 27 and 34 of the Free Movement of Persons Act (PFZG, LGBI. 2009 No. 348) apply to Swiss nationals and their family members Articles 23 and 27 of the Foreign Nationals Act (AuG, LGBI. 2008 No. 311) apply to non-EEA and non-Swiss nationals and their family members .
Scope of application:	All nationals whose establishment permit is about to expire and must be renewed to extend their stay.
Deadlines:	The application must be submitted in full and correctly to the Migration and Passport Office (APA) no later than 14 days before the residence permit expires.
General information:	Individuals who spend the majority of their time abroad for the purpose of studying/training should use the form Retention of permit (ger. „Beibehalt der Bewilligung“). Persons who return to Liechtenstein every day despite studying/training do not need to retain their permit. However, the daily return to Liechtenstein must be confirmed in writing (informally).

Permanent residence (D)

Legal basis:	Articles 24 and 34 of the Law on the Free Movement of Persons (PFZG, LGBl. 2009 No. 348) apply to EEA nationals and their family members
Scope of application:	All nationals whose permanent residence permit is due for renewal and must be extended to allow for continued residence.
Deadlines:	The application must be submitted to the Office of Immigration and Passports, complete and correct, no later than 14 days before the expiration of the validity period of the permanent residence permit.
General information:	Individuals who spend the majority of their time abroad for the purpose of studying/training should use the form Retention of permit (ger. „Beibehalt der Bewilligung“). Persons who return to Liechtenstein every day despite studying/training do not need to retain their permit. However, the daily return to Liechtenstein must be confirmed in writing (informally).
